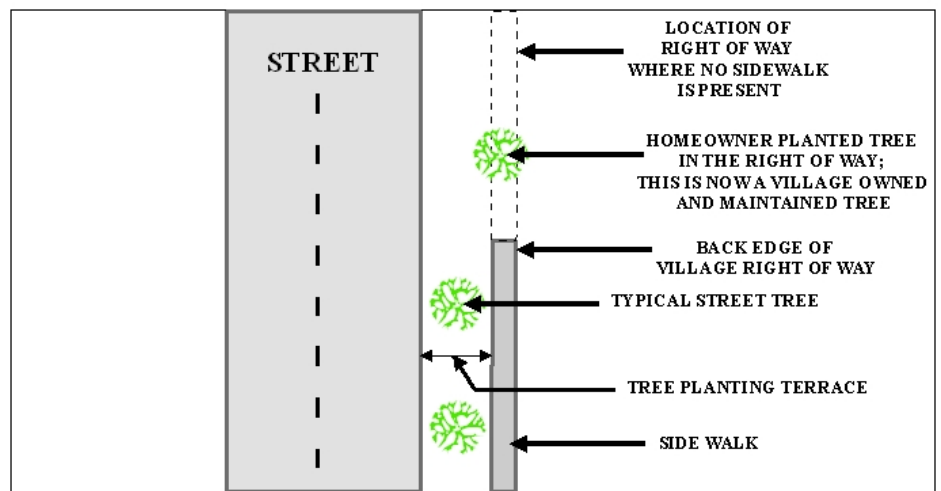




UNAUTHORIZED RIGHT-OF-WAY PLANTING

Trees or other vegetation, that at maturity exceeds 24" in height, cannot be planted in the street right-of-way without a planting permit.

The right-of-way is the area along the street from the curb to (typically) 6"-12" beyond the sidewalk or where the sidewalk would be. The sidewalk location can often be seen in the driveway; however widths may vary from street to street and block to block. If you are unsure of the right-of-way set back in front of your property, please call before you do any landscaping.



For vehicle and pedestrian vision and safety purposes, shrubs, evergreens, grade changes, planting berms, and raised beds are not allowed in the right-of-way. To prevent costly removal to you, be sure of right-a-way locations along your property prior to landscaping or planting.



Street trees are permitted, providing they are located in the proper location and taken from the acceptable species list on the permit application. Planting permit applications include information on location, acceptable tree species, and other specifications to follow before planting. Planting permit applications can be obtained at no cost from the Forestry Division.
